

Focus artist: **Modelling Tools:** Focus artwork: Clarice Cliff (1899 - 1972) Clarice Cliff was a very famous designer of dishes and decorative household items from the Clay Tools early part of the 20th century. In 1927, Clarice developed a new design for pottery that was unique and unlike anything that had been made before. The pottery was called "Bizarre," and it Sponge Bizarre (1927) featured bright colours and modern shapes. | Back stamp | A mark stamped on the back of a plate or pottery, usually named and dated. |
| Člay | Moist, stiff earth that is used for making brick, pottery, and tile. |
| Slip | Liquid clay used like glue to join two pieces of clay together. |
