(1956 - Present) Andy Goldsworthy is a renowned British artist who works with found natural elements. He is a naturalist, meaning that all of his art is made from or related to nature.

Goldsworthy is inspired by all aspects of the natural world, including snowflakes, twigs, icicles, reeds, tree roots, and rocks.
