



What should I know already?	What will I know by the end of the unit?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To begin to identify and use a variety of different types of materials used for collage. To arrange and glue materials to different backgrounds. To fold, crumple, tear and overlap paper and other materials to create a collage. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Begin to identify different forms of textiles, and match and sort fabrics and threads (e.g. colour, texture, shape). To gain confidence in stitching two pieces of fabric, explain how to thread a needle and have a go. To change and modify threads and fabrics e.g. knotting, fraying, fringing, pulling threads, twisting, plaiting. To gain experience in colouring textiles e.g. printing, fabric crayons, dipping.

Focus artist:

Nancy Crow

(1943 – Present) Nancy Crow is an American art quilter and fibre artist. She is one of the leading figures in the development of the art quilting movement of the 1970s and 1980s. She made her first quilt for her baby son. She creates designs with vibrant colourful patterns and geometric shapes.

Vocabulary I will need to know:

Contemporary art	Art produced at this present point in time or since the 1960/70s.
Quilting	To sew together to make a quilt. A quilt is a type of bed covering.
Textile/Fabric	A cloth made by knitting or weaving.
Thread	A fine cord used in sewing, weaving, and the like, which is usually made of two or more fibres such as cotton twisted together.
Needle	A thin instrument made of steel with a hole at one end for thread and a sharp point at the other. A needle is used for sewing cloth.
Sew	To make or repair with a needle and thread.
Stitch	The movement of a needle and thread through cloth or other material when sewing.
Running stitch	A simple stitch consisting of a line of small even stitches which run back and forth through the fabric without overlapping.
Knotting	The action or craft of tying knots in threads and fabrics.
Fringing	To cause loosely hanging threads at the edge of fabric.
Fraying	To cause the threads in cloth or rope to become slightly separated.
Plaiting	To join three or more pieces of thread by putting them over each other in a special pattern.
