Characteristics of Effective Learning:

Playing and Exploring (engagement) – Finding out and exploring, Playing with what they know, Being willing to 'have a go'
Active Learning (motivation) – Being involved and concentrating, Keeping on trying, Enjoying achieving what they set out to do
Creating and Thinking Critically (thinking) – Having their own ideas. Making links, Choosing ways to do things

Quality representations of home furniture. Room specific resources eg kitchen utensils, tablecloth, oven gloves. Dressing up clothes Dolls – male, female, ethnic characteristics. Enough space to enable children to move around freely. Develop role – play boxes in response to children's interests i.e. birthday box, ice cream shop, going to the doctors etc. Adult role Engage in role-play with the children. Plan additional resources for the likes of a celebration. Encourage children to tidy up when necessary and treat equipment with respect and care. 	 Provide opportunities for: Playing out real life situations and experiences. Fantasy play and story making. Dressing up. Discussing experiences, ideas and negotiating roles, delivering messages. Making props for play. Writing for a purpose. Celebrating birthdays and festivals. Children contributing to planning – take a leading role. Using stories, experiences as a stimulus. Reflecting on feelings during role play Respecting and caring for resources. 	Vocabulary related to resources: Cup, saucer, plate, cooker etc. Vocabulary related to family, food and healt safety, PSED, Festive and Celebrations
