Subject: Music

Unit 4 : Round and Round

Overview:

In this sequence of learning, we will be studying Bossa Nova music. The children will continue to learn about pulse, rhythm, and pitch and how these musical elements work together. We will focus on a song titled 'Round and Round!'. The children will use the tune to improvise and compose their own versions.

What should I already know?

Songs and Styles

- To be introduced to Reggae music.
- To know that Reggae music was originally from Jamaica and is a mixture of styles with elements of rock and soul music.

Appraising

- To identify instruments/voices that can be heard in the main song and other music.

Games

- To be able to find the pulse in a piece of music and march in time with it.
- To be able to copy, clap back and make up own rhythms.
- Be able to clap the rhythm of own name and favourite colour.
- To know that pitch is high and low sounds.

Singing

- To know and be able to sing 'Rhythm In the Way We Walk' off by heart and to rap with the song.

Performing

- As part of a class, to perform with rapping, singing, playing and movement.
- To be able to talk about the performance afterwards in terms of how it made them feel and whether it is right for recording.

Vocabulary:

Pulse

The regular heartbeat of the music; its steady beat.

Rhythm

Long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.

Pitch

High and low sounds.

Improvise

To make up a tune and play it on the spot

Compose

Create and develop musical ideas and 'fixing' them

Melody

Another name for tune

Perform

To sing and play instruments for others to hear

Singers

People who sing the song

Audience

People who watch a performance

Imagination

An image or picture in your mind

Bossa Nova

A Brazilian dance music that has syncopated guitar rhythms.

Instruments

Bass guitar

Songs and Styles

- To be introduced to Bossa Nova through the following songs/music: -
 - Livin' La Vida Loca by Ricky Martin
 - Imperial War March by John Williams
 - It Had Better Be Tonight by Michael Buble
 - Why Don't You by Gramophonedzie
 - Oya Como Va by Santana
- To know that Bossa Nova is Brazilian dance music that has syncopated guitar rhythms.

Appraising

- To identify instruments/voices that can be heard in the main song and other music: singers, keyboard, bass, guitar, percussion, trumpets and saxophones.

Games

- To be able to find the pulse in a piece of music and march in time with it.

- To be able to copy and clap back rhythms.
- Be able to clap the rhythm of own name and favourite animal.
- To be able to make up own rhythms.
- To know that pitch is high and low sounds.

Singing

- To know and be able to sing 'Round and Round' off by heart.
- To be able to dance with the song.

Playing

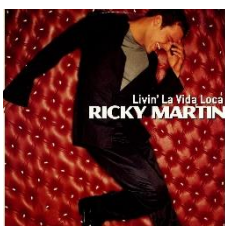
- To be able to play the glockenspiel using up to three notes using D, F and C.
