Unit: Basic first aid; Environment/Community; Careers/Aspiration

Overview:

During this sequence of learning, pupils will know how to identify an emergency situation. They will know what to look out for when someone needs help quickly and how to respond safely and calmly. This sequence of learning will allow pupils to participate in wider community events and represent their school within the community. This sequence will allow children to explore different careers to start thinking about what they would like to achieve in the future.

What should I already know?

- Keeping our body clean by washing regularly will help reduce illness causing bacteria. This will lower the risk for disease.
- I will know that good hygiene is important because it will help to prevent infection in wounds and skin irritation.
- To keep a body clean and healthy you must wash your body daily, clean your teeth once a day, wash your hair with some sort of shampoo at least once a week and wash hands regularly throughout the day. Washing your clothes keeps them free from disease causing germs.
- It is important to look after yourself first in an emergency situation because you cannot help others if you are not safe. You have a better chance to save your family after saving yourself first.
- It is important to raise money for charities as they rely on donations from the public. Charities then use this money to improve their services. We raise money by attracting the attention of members of the public. This could be done by doing a cake sale. Members of the community will donate a cake and the money you raise will be donated to the charity.
- A career is a long term job. It is important to find a career that you enjoy. By participating in a careers day you will get to see what different careers are in the community.
- To achieve a goal in life it is important to believe in yourself. You need to work out what steps you need to take to achieve your goal.

Vocabulary:

Risk

A situation involving an exposure to danger.

Safe

Protection from or not being exposed to danger and not being harmed.

Emergency services

A public organisation that responds to deal with emergencies when they occur.



Careers

An occupation or job that is undertaken for a significant period of time.

Environment

The surroundings or conditions where a person, plant or animal lives.

What will I know by the end of the unit?

- An emergency situation is a situation that risks a person's health, security, property or environment. An emergency situation is best to be resolved by professional emergency service men and women.
- It is important to get help from an appropriate adult in emergency situations so that they can assess the risk and prevent further emergencies from happening.
- It is important to stay calm in an emergency situation

Emergency situation

An emergency situation is any situation that poses an immediate threat to a person's health, security, property, or environment.

Community events

An event that is held for members of the community.
