Focus artist: Focus artwork: **Frances Gearhart** Frances Gearhart (1869 -1959) was an American printmaker and watercolourist known for her boldly drawn and coloured woodcut and linocut prints of American landscapes. She focused especially on California's coasts and mountains. She is one of the most important American colour block print artists of the early 20th century. Mono printing A form of printmaking where the image can only be made once. Relief Printing A technique where an image is carved into a printing block and then pressed onto paper and make a print. Landscape A picture that shows a view of an area. Foreground | The part of a picture or scene that is nearest to the front. Background | The part of a picture or scene that is towards the back. A way of showing objects on the flat surface of a picture so that they seem the Perspective correct size and distance from one another. Printing block A block used in printing, with a pattern carved into it. To cut (a hard material) in order to produce an object or design. Carve The space around and between the subject(s) of an image. Negative space Positive space The areas in a work of art that are the subjects, or areas of interest. Printing Ink A coloured liquid used for printing. A device used to spread ink/paint evenly over a printing block. Roller
