Wassily Kandinsky



(1866 - 1944) Kandinsky was born in Odessa, Russia. As a child, he studied drawing. As an adult, he enrolled in art school where he met and was inspired by many different artists.

Many people believe Kandinsky to be the founder of abstract art, and he thought that feelings and music could be expressed through colours and shapes in his paintings.



Expressionism	Art movement in the 20th Century where artists made artwork that

Abstract art	Art that does not represent images of the everyday world, and uses
	colour, lines or shape.
Line	Lines are used by artists to describe (draw) an object.
Shape	A shape is a flat, enclosed area created through lines.
Square	A plane figure with four equal straight sides and four right angles.
Circle	A round plane figure.
Triangle	A plane figure with three straight sides.
Concentric	Circles of different sizes that have the same centre point.
Pastel	Crayons made of powdered pigment, softer than wax crayons.
Crayon	A pencil or stick of coloured chalk or wax, used for drawing.
Pencil	An instrument for writing/drawing, consisting of a thin stick of
