Unit: How do Christians belong to their faith family?

Overview:		
<p>During this sequence of learning, pupils will explore the key beliefs of Christianity and what belonging to a religious family means.</p>		
What should I already know?	Vocabulary:	
<p>Christianity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Baptism is a Christian ceremony. When someone is baptized, they become a follower of Jesus. Families come together to celebrate baptism. After the Church service, a party is usually held for families and friends to celebrate together. 	<p>Christianity/ Christians</p> <p>Followers of a religion.</p>	
	<p>God</p> <p>Christians believe in God. God is also called the Holy Spirit.</p>	
What will I know by the end of the unit?		
<p>Human/Social Sciences</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Religion is not a place - it is about people believing, worshipping and valuing. Religion is about belonging to a faith family and community. <p>Christianity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Christians belong to a Christian faith family and community. To a Christian, the church is a group of people (a community) who all believe in Jesus and want to meet together to worship God and learn more about their faith. Belonging to a religious family means followers are part of a bigger family where there are shared views and values about God, friendship and support. To be part of the Christian family, followers: - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> spend time talking to God through prayer; set time aside for reading about God, help and being kind to others; thank others; forgive others 	<p>Jesus</p> <p>God spoke to Jesus - the saviour of Christianity who was born on Christmas Day.</p>	
	<p>Bible</p> <p>The main sacred text of Christianity.</p>	
	<p>Church</p> <p>A building used for public Christian religious services and worship.</p>	
	<p>Worship</p> <p>Love and devotion shown to a being or an object.</p>	
	<p>Baptism</p> <p>A Christian ceremony in which someone who wishes to join the church is sprinkled with water or dipped in water.</p>	
	<p>Christening</p> <p>To give a name to at baptism.</p>	
	<p>Vicar</p> <p>In charge of a church and often leads religious services.</p>	
	<p>Cross</p> <p>Used as a symbol for Christianity - Jesus died on the cross.</p>	
	<p>Font</p> <p>An open container that holds holy water for baptism.</p>

Belief or trust in something that has never been proved.

Community

An area where a group of people live.

Belief

A strong opinion.

Godparent

An adult who promises at a child's baptism to take on certain responsibilities for the child.

Anointed

To make holy by applying oil.
