Unit: What do my senses tell me about the world of religion and belief?

### Overview:

During this sequence of learning, pupils will look at what their senses tell them about the world of religion and belief. They will also study what is good and bad.

### What should I already know?

- From EYFS  
Christianity and Hinduism
- Introduction to religious beliefs through stories e.g Christmas and the Nativity story; Rama and Sita
  - Introduction to the following key vocabulary: Religious, God, belief, Sacred book - The Bible
  - Introduce the concept of 'celebration' and how/what people celebrate - Bonfire Night, Christmas, Chinese New Year, Easter.
  - Talk about what celebrations and festivals the children have taken part in.
  - Identify simple features of religious life and practice in a family context.
  - Recognise some religious symbols, place of worship (church, temple) and teachings in Christianity and Hinduism.
  - Explore the similarities and difference between the religions: - different stories, artefacts and places of worship

Christianity

- Christianity is one of the world religions. It is a religion that believes in one God.
- People that follow the religion of Christianity are called Christians.
- Christians are people who believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.
- Christians worship in churches
- The Christian holy book is called the Bible.

Hinduism

- Hinduism is one of the world religions. It is a religion that believes in many gods. People that follow the religion of Hinduism are called Hindus.
- Hindus worship one supreme being called Brahma who created other gods to be his helpers - Vishnu and Shiva.
- Hindus believe that God is not up in heaven but inside each and every person, waiting to be discovered.
- Hindus worship in a Hindu Temple which is also called a Mandir.
- Hindus have several holy books; they are called Vedas.

Judaism

- Judaism is one of the world religions. It is a religion that believes in one god.
- People that follow Judaism are called Jews.
- Jews worship in a synagogue.
- The Jewish holy book is called the Torah.
