Year: 2 Subject: RSHE Block 4 Living in the Wider World
Unit: Basic first aid; Environment/Community; Careers/Aspiration

Overview:

During this sequence of learning, pupils will identify an emergency situation where someone needs help quickly. Pupils will understand the importance of recycling and looking after the environment. Pupils will identify what they want to be when they are older and what an aspiration is.

What should I already know?

- When you help someone who needs first aid, you must keep yourself safe. This could mean looking out for any dangers, or making sure you're with an adult you know and trust to help you. You can always call for help if you need to.
- There are many things I can do to help look after the environment such as picking up litter, recycling and reusing materials, using less petrol and buying local produce.
- It is good to have aspirations; hopes and dreams for the future so that I have something to aim for.
- It is important to look after the environment. The changes we make now are essential for future generations.

Vocabulary:

Risk	The possibility of something bad happening.
Safe	Not in danger or likely to be harmed.
Emergency Services	Organisations you can call in the event of an emergency; police, fire service, ambulance, coastguard.

What will I know by the end of the unit?

- To recognise dangers, quickly identify what is an emergency situation and the importance of calling for adult help. This could be dialling 999 to ask for help from one of the emergency services.
- How I might feel in a situation where first aid is needed, recognise these feelings and feel prepared to help. It is a good thing to stay calm in times when I feel under pressure or worried.
- Pollution is when large amounts of gases, smoke and chemicals are put into the environment that makes it harmful for humans, animals and plants.
- There are things we can do to reduce pollution such as walk or ride a bike to school instead of using a car, turn off lights or electronic items when you are not using them, not dropping litter and recycling items so they can be used again.
- Recycling means making rubbish into something new. Every time you throw something away it gets sent to a landfill. More and more rubbish is piled on top until it is too big and the landfill has to be closed.
- An aspiration is something you hope to achieve in the future. It is important to identify goals to aim for as this will help motivate you to get better at things that will help you achieve your dreams.

Environment	The air, water and land in or on which people, animals and plants live.
Plastic	A man-made material that can be shaped when soft into different forms and has many different uses.
Pollution	Damage caused to water or air by harmful substances.
Recycling	The process of collecting and changing old materials such as plastic, glass, paper or fabric so that it can be used again.
