In this sequence of learning, pupils will consider how and why they should show respect towards the communities they are a part of and consider the importance of considering the feelings of those we share our communities with. Pupils will explore the potential risks of using the internet and how restrictions aim to reduce these. They will also explore the importance of being respectful online and pupils will explore the potential risks of gambling.		
What should I already know?	Vocabulary	
- Protected characteristics are things about people that must be respected, like age, disability, or religion. - A hate crime is when someone is hurt or treated badly because of who they are, which is wrong. - A crime breaks the law, but a hate crime targets someone for being different. - My actions can make the world better when I choose kindness and fairness. - Respect means treating people the way I want to be treated. - I can show respect in shared spaces by taking care of them and being considerate of others. - Jobs and careers are different kinds of work people do. - People choose jobs for many reasons, and stereotypes can stop us from choosing what we truly want.	Communities 	Groups of people who live, learn, or spend time together, like your school or neighbourhood.
	Families 	People who care for you, look after you, and support you.
	Neighbourhood	The area around your home where you and other people live.
	Empathy 	Understanding how someone else feels and caring about their feelings.
	Age appropriate	Something that is safe and suitable for your age.
What will I know by the end of the sequence?	Protect	To keep someone safe from harm.
- We are part of different communities, like our school, family, and neighbourhood. - Communities have rules and laws to keep everyone safe and happy. - If people don't follow rules, others can get hurt or feel unsafe. - Respect and empathy help us understand others and be kind. - Children can use the internet, but only in safe and age-appropriate ways. - There are rules for children online to help protect them.	Unsafe content	Things online that are not suitable for children and could make you feel worried or uncomfortable.
	Gambling 	When people risk money hoping to win more, but they can lose instead.
